

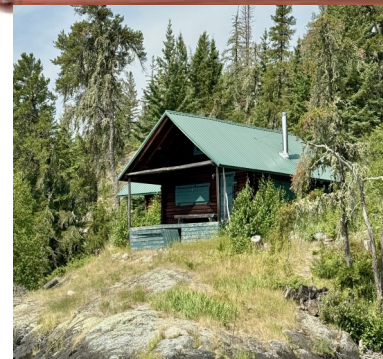
Grab your packsack and some Maps

- The other sites have no docking, just bare rock or sand. Be prepared to rough it.
- Some sites will have snacks, tea, lemonade or water, but bring your own lunch and drinks too. A chair might be handy if you want to sit awhile.
